
WHITE OAK



General Notes - - - Native to Eastern North America.

Branches don't droop and resist breakage.

Tree Characteristics

Conical or Rounded Shape. Has Deciduous foliage.

Height: 60 - 100 feet. Growth Rate: 12 to 24 Inches per Season.

Leaves Ovate, Green, Red, Deciduous.

Flowers Inconspicuous. Brown. Has separate male and female flowers on the same tree.

Shading Capacity Rated as Moderate to Moderately Dense in Leaf.

Sunset Zones 1 - 3 and 10. USDA Hardiness Zones 3 - 9.

Exposure Full Sun to Partial Shade.

Wet but Well Drained Soil. Loam or Sand Texture. Acidic Soil pH.

Salinity Tolerance is Good Inland.

Pests & Disease Information

Susceptible to Leaf Miner, Caterpillars, Borer, Aphids, Scales and Insect Galls, Anthracnose, Canker, Leaf Spot, Powdery Mildew, Root Rot and Chlorosis.
